Healthcare Scholarships

High School Healthcare Scholarships

Available to Lake, Missoula, or Ravalli County seniors intending to pursue a health-related career

Professional Development Scholarships

Targeted funds supporting training and certifications that advance patient care



High School Healthcare Scholarships

- Program established in 1990, with more than \$570,000 awarded to 718 recipients
- More than 130 donors supporting scholarship awards
- 15 scholarships awarded to students from seven schools in Lake, Missoula, and Ravalli County in 2024



Professional Development Scholarships

- \$2,500 awarded for opportunities in obstetrics and neonatal, nursing, and rehabilitation education
- Recipient education benefiting communities and patient care in Missoula, Dillon, Ronan, Arlee and Polson



Safe Kids Leadership

As lead agency for **Safe Kids Missoula** and **Safe Kids Montana**, we protect children from preventable injury —the leading cause of death for youth through collaborative education, network-building, and advocacy.



Be Sun Smart

- More than 275 educational cards, sunscreen packets, UV-rated sunglasses, and other items distributed
- Nearly 130 individuals received direct education through partnerships with Raise Montana, Missoula Family YMCA, and Upward Bound



Safe Kids Leadership

- Nearly 400 volunteer hours provided and 900+ individuals reached with direct education through car seat checkups, educational sessions, and community events
- Participation in the State Health Improvement Plan Design Team, PLTI Civic Design Team, Missoula Drug Safety Coalition, Drive Safe Missoula coalition, and more

Patient Assistance Grants

Our **Ava Nicole Breast Health Fund**, **Community Oncology Patient Fund**, and **Chumrau & Robinson Endowment** provide care-related financial support for Western Montana patients and families.

Health Grants

Endowed funds provide focused support for health-related projects of nonprofit organizations and educational institutions.

Patient Assistance Grants

- Approximately \$17,800 provided to support care-related costs such as gas cards, medical expenses, wigs, and more
- 58 patients from communities including Darby, Garrison, Arlee, Missoula, Townsend, Polson, Saint Ignatius, Butte, Thompson Falls, Hamilton, and more received assistance



Health Grants Program

- \$53,406 awarded to 12 nonprofit organizations across Western Montana
- Recipient projects served 2,398 western Montanans and provided mental health support, diabetes education, patient support, case management, and more



Your Gifts

- More than \$110,000 received for health education and support in western Montana
- More than 70 volunteers engaged in education and service
- Connection and collaboration with 40+ partner organizations

Gift Impact and Management

- More than \$580,000 disbursed or used to support our mission in FY2024
- As of June 30, 2024, more than \$6.9 million in assets overseen by Finance/Investments Committee and the Board, with invested funds professionally managed in partnership with First Interstate Wealth Management
